## BIOGRAPHY

Julia Berghofer is an European Leadership Network (ELN) Policy Fellow and Project Manager for the Younger Generation Leaders Network on Euro-Atlantic Security (YGLN)

Prior to joining the ELN, Julia Berghofer was a research assistant with the German Institute for International and Security Affairs (SWP) in Berlin until 2018 and a project assistant in the organisational team of the Munich Security Conference (MSC) until 2017. Previously, she worked for the Heinrich Böll Foundation offices in Berlin and Brussels, the German Institute for Global and Area Studies (GIGA) and at the Institute of Educational Sciences at the University of the Federal Armed Forces in Hamburg.

Julia Berghofer holds a Bachelor in Political and Communication Sciences from the Ludwig-Maximilians-University in Munich and the University of Vienna, and completed her Master in Political Science at the University of Hamburg in 2016. Her thesis was a scenario analysis on the future number of nuclear weapon states.

She is a Vice-chair of the YGLN and a member of the Réseau Nucléaire et Stratégie – Nouvelle Génération (RNS-NG, promo 2017/18). Julia Berghofer served as a member of the German board of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) until 2016.

Her research areas include nuclear arms control, disarmament, West-Russia relations and NATO.

### BIOGRAPHY

Tobias Bunde is a postdoctoral researcher at the Hertie School's Centre for International Security as well as Director of Research and Policy at the Munich Security Conference. He is also a member of the Executive Board of the Munich Security Conference Foundation.

Dr. Bunde studied international relations at various institutions in Germany, France, and the United States and received his PhD in Political Science from Freie Universität Berlin.

His academic research focusses on the foreign and security policies of Western democracies, in particular Germany and the United States, the future of the West and international order as well as nuclear security.

Dr. Bunde is also the project lead of the research project "Understanding Nuclear Assurance, Deterrence and Escalation in Europe", funded by the Stanton Foundation, and the lead author of the annual Munich Security Report, which serves as the scene-setter for the annual Munich Security Conference.

## BIOGRAPHY

Angela Stent is Director of the Center for Eurasian, Russian and East European Studies and Professor of Government and Foreign Service at Georgetown University. She is also a Senior Fellow (non-resident) at the Brookings Institution and co-chairs its Hewett Forum on Post-Soviet Affairs.

During the academic year 2015-2016 she is a fellow at the Transatlantic Academy of the German Marshall Fund. From 2004-2006 she served as National Intelligence Officer for Russia and Eurasia at the National Intelligence Council. From 1999 to 2001, she served in the Office of Policy Planning at the U.S. Department of State. Stent's academic work focuses on the triangular political and economic relationship between the United States, Russia and Europe.

She is a member of the senior advisory panel for NATO's Supreme Allied Commander in Europe. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. She is a contributing editor to *Survival* and is on the editorial boards of the *Journal of Cold War Studies*, *World Policy Journal*, *Internationale Politik* and *Mirovaia Ekonomika i Mezhdunarodnie Otnosheniie*. She has served on the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council for Russia and Central Asia. She is a Trustee of the Eurasia Foundation and of Supporters of Civil Society in Russia.

Dr. Stent received her B.A. from Cambridge University, her MSc. with distinction from the London School of Economics and Political Science and her M.A. and PhD. from Harvard University.
